This partnership complements Shared Services' regional contracts with a full portfolio of national contracts. Premier also has the most comprehensive and largest program designed specifically for allied health providers available.

Robert L. Sloan



Bob has faithfully served the Washington metropolitan healthcare community for more than 30 years with a rare combination of skills that makes him a singularly effective, productive, inspirational, compassionate and visionary leader.

During his 27 year tenure at Sibley's helm, Bob transformed a community hospital into a regional medical force. His ability to bring clarity, focus and direction to the most complex challenges allowed Sibley to dramatically expand its campus, modernize its facilities, pioneer cutting-edge technologies, develop a culture of constant quality improvement and bring the Johns Hopkins Health System to the nation's capital. This dynamic positive growth resulted, in large part, from his skill communicating with a wide range of internal and external audiences, always recognizing the most relevant issues to each and connecting on a personal level.

Bob has also always been big on giving back. For decades he has enthusiastically contributed time and resources to the area's leading healthcare and charitable organizations. He has touched tens of thousands of lives by partnering with charities to provide an array of medical services to those in need without the ability to pay. Bob helped found and was the original Board Chairman of D.C.'s Community of Hope, an organization whose mission is to "improve the health and quality of life for low-income, homeless and underserved families and individuals in the District of Columbia by providing healthcare, housing with supportive services, educational opportunities, and spiritual support". The Community of Hope is now planning a \$25 million healthcare facility in Ward 8.

Bob's outstanding administrative judgment at Prince Georges General Hospital and Medical Center, Columbia Hospital for Women and Sibley Memorial Hospital has elevated and expanded quality care in our region. Bob's impressive accomplishments are a result of his personal integrity, honesty, humility and unwavering commitment to ethical leadership. It is my privilege to nominate Bob Sloan, a man who leads by example, for the honor of this year's McNulty Award.
