- **KN95 Mask Available at NCASS:** Item Number: KY333 are available the week of May 11 at the Calverton, MD office. S2S, private labeling company for Premier, made these mask available to NCASS through an allotment program. Eleven cases with 1,500 masks per case are still available as of today. These KN95's are made available at our cost per case of \$6,398.
