Guidelines, Information, and Policies Updates:

- As of today (July 15) HHS has made significant changes to the COVID-19 daily data reporting process. [Find all the details here.](#)
- The American Hospital Association is launching a service called AHA Digital Pulse, designed to help health care organizations assess their digital capabilities. If interested in more information, please go to the [AHA Digital Pulse website.](#)
- In a letter expected to be sent to governors soon, the Trump administration will recommend that states deploy the National Guard to hospitals to help them improve data collection about COVID-19 patients, supplies and capacity. [More details can be found here.](#)
- This week HHS, through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), announced approximately \$3 billion in funding to hospitals serving a large percentage of vulnerable populations on thin margins and approximately \$1 billion to specialty rural hospitals, urban hospitals with certain rural Medicare designations, and hospitals in small metropolitan areas. - HHS is also revising the existing payment formula for a [May funding tranche](#) so as to include certain special rural Medicare designation hospitals in urban areas as well as others who provide care in smaller non-rural communities. - There is some concern that protective gear for healthcare workers (PPE) is beginning to run low again as some parts of the country see dramatic rises in cases and hospitalizations. [Read more from the AP.](#)
- The NIH has launched a clinical trials network to test COVID-19 vaccines and other prevention tools. [More information here.](#)
- The WHO issued new guidelines on COVID-19 to state that there are [some instances of potential indoor airborne transmission](#), but the agency didn't go as far as to say that the coronavirus can spread through the air.
- The FDA's list of potentially harmful hand sanitizers has expanded to 59 varieties that could contain methanol, which is toxic when ingested or absorbed through the skin. [Story and details here.](#)
